If you are lucky you might even spot some playful dingo pups leaping about on your bush walk. Be aware, however, that they generally will be closely guarded by their watchful parents. Dingoes, though not unique to this neck of the woods, do seem to find Hawks Nest a wonderful place to live, breed and thrive. Although not everyone will agree, we are fortunate to have these natural predators in our space. Dingoes, according to official data, are important to our ecosystem. They generally mind their own business, keep feral species in check and are a significant drawcard for tourists. Whilst dingoes (physically) closely resemble domestic dogs, it is very important to remember that they are a wild species and should therefore neither be befriended nor fed. Using your phone internationally:

Most cellular service suppliers have daily add-on options to purchase international data plans. Contact your provider to select the right international data plan for you. If you decide not to add an international plan to your service, be aware of possible costly roaming charges. In this situation, divert all your calls to voicemail and put a message that you can be contacted by SMS or (if applicable) by email. Make sure your roaming is switched off and you are solely using Wi-Fi while abroad.

DID YOU KNOW that:


