Unfortunately, if we intend to 'hang around' for some time yet we somehow have to learn to live with the craziness. Thankfully I was made aware of this before falling for the scam. Let me explain: I looked online because I wanted to order a beautiful bunch of flowers. The flowers were to be delivered in a different location and in my absence. So, I began to browse the internet for such a service in said location and before long found what I had been looking for....or so I thought! I picked an impressive floral bunch and was just about to make payment when I was made aware of a flower scam (yes, you read correctly!) a flower scam!!! Through our truly tech savvy Tech Tips provider I found out that it wasn't very long ago that a florist was ordered pay \$1 million for its misleading local representation. It was as early as in 2022 that the ACCC (The Australian Competition And Consumer Commission) put the online florist industry on notice as regards reports of false or misleading representations about the location of online florists. Goodness gracious me! Who'd even think of such a thing? You order flowers online in good faith and trust that the actual flowers you chose get delivered on time at the location of your choice. Well, think again!!! You chose, you order, you pay and sometimes a very different bunch of flowers to the one you had ordered gets (possibly) delivered days late or not at all. - Review multiple search results on their online search engine landing pages, as the top search result may not be the best option.
- Shop directly with a florist, if you prefer, who is local to the recipient's address. Be sure to check for the provider's street address and suburb.
- Check social media pages to confirm that the florist operates locally (for example, look for photos of a store front and the option to collect flowers from the store).
